

CHANGE SUBSCRIPTION?

Hello holiday home owner! We will begin working with Near-Sorted Collection, a new system for sorting packaging close to your property.

As you currently have the Private Waste Bin subscription, you will receive an additional bin for plastic and paper packaging. If you choose the Shared Space subscription instead, you will not have your own bins. You will leave your food waste, residual waste and packaging waste at a shared collection point.



You have the option to change your subscription

As a holiday home owner, you may switch from the Private Waste Bin subscription to the Shared Space option if that better suits you better.

What will happen when Near-Sorted Collection begins?

During the snow-free season of 2026, those of you with the Private Waste Bin subscription will receive an additional 370-liter waste bin. It is slightly larger than your current 240-liter bin for food and residual waste. In the new divided bin, you will sort plastic and paper packaging. We call this service Near-Sorted Collection. Collection will begin in early 2027.

Why is this change being made?

Near-Sorted Collection is a legal requirement throughout Sweden under the Packaging Ordinance and must be implemented by 1 January 2027. The purpose is to ensure that more packaging is recycled by making it easier to sort correctly.

Starting with plastic and paper packaging

Plastic and paper packaging are the types of packaging that most often end up in residual waste instead of being sorted correctly. That is why we are starting with these materials, as collecting them delivers significant environmental benefits by ensuring that more packaging is recycled and kept out of residual waste.

So what about glass and metal packaging? We are currently reviewing how the collection of glass and metal packaging will be organised. Under current legislation, these packaging types must also be collected close to properties, which may mean that an additional bin will be provided.

No additional cost

Near-Sorted Collection does not involve any additional fee. Packaging collection is financed through producer responsibility, which means that the companies placing packaging on the market pay for the collection.

You can share a bin with your neighbors

You may share bin with up to two of your closest neighbors (a total of three households). It is important that all shared packaging waste fits in the bin and that no packaging is placed in the residual waste.

Our LAVAB app makes it easier to keep track of your next collection day – you will receive a reminder the day before.

The Shared Space subscription

If you choose the Shared Space subscription, containers for food and residual waste are available at selected shared collection points in the municipality.

Many of these locations also have recycling containers for paper, plastic, metal, colored and clear glass packaging, as well as newspapers and small batteries.

The containers for food and residual waste are locked with iLOQ locks, and you need to register to gain access.

You will normally use your nearest shared collection point, but you will have access to all shared collection points in the municipality.

More information is available on our website, where you can find the locations of all shared collection points. These locations are also available in the LAVAB app.

Subscription fees for 2026

Shared Space: SEK 1,675 per year (includes a base fee of SEK 905 and a collection fee of SEK 770)

Private Waste Bin: SEK 1,940 per year (includes a base fee of SEK 905 and a collection fee of SEK 1,035) + weight-based fee

The weight-based fee is based on the amount of waste placed in the bin:

- Food waste: SEK 2.60 per kg
- Residual waste: SEK 5.00 per kgg

If you would like to keep your Private Waste Bin subscription, you will also receive the new bin for plastic and paper packaging (Near-Sorted Collection).

If you choose the Shared Space subscription, you will instead leave your packaging at the shared collection point.

Sort more and reduce residual waste

Whichever option you choose, Private Waste Bin or Shared Space, it is equally important to sort correctly. When you separate food waste and packaging, less waste ends up in residual waste. This benefits both the environment and waste management costs.

After food waste and packaging have been sorted out, there is usually not much left. What remains is residual waste, such as vacuum cleaner bags, cotton swabs and dish brushes.

Food waste is turned into biogas and biofertiliser. Packaging that is sorted correctly is recycled and made into new products.
